Sample 3-Day Itinerary

Day 1:

- Morning: Explore the National Mall and visit the Lincoln Memorial
- Afternoon: Tour the Smithsonian National Museum of American History
- Evening: Dinner in Penn Quarter and a walk around the Capitol Reflecting Pool

Day 2:

- Morning: Visit the U.S. Capitol and Library of Congress
- Afternoon: Lunch in Eastern Market and explore Capitol Hill
- Evening: Enjoy live jazz in U Street Corridor

Day 3:

- Morning: Stroll through Georgetown and the waterfront
- Afternoon: Visit the Kennedy Center or the Phillips Collection
- Evening: Dine in Dupont Circle and enjoy rooftop views
