- 9/11 Memorial (quiet, powerful)
- Wall Street & the Charging Bull
- Battery Park for Statue of Liberty views without the ferry

Greenwich Village (Bohemian, cozy, great food)

- Washington Square Park
- Comedy Cellar
- Endless cafés and jazz clubs

SoHo & Nolita (Shopping + style)

- Cast-iron buildings
- Independent boutiques
- Great brunch spots

Brooklyn (Cooler than Manhattan, but don't tell Manhattan)

- DUMBO for skyline views
 - Williamsburg for food + nightlife
 - Brooklyn Bridge Park for sunsets
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What to Eat (and Where)

NYC is a food city. Don't waste meals.

Classic NYC bites

- **Pizza:** Joe's Pizza (Greenwich Village)
- **Bagels:** Ess-a-Bagel or Russ & Daughters
- **Pastrami:** Katz's Delicatessen

Trendy & delicious

- **Buvette** (West Village) – tiny French plates
- **Prince Street Pizza** – spicy pepperoni square slice
- **Los Tacos No. 1** (Chelsea Market) – shockingly good

- Levain Bakery (the cookie everyone talks about)
 - Dominique Ansel Bakery (home of the cronut)
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What to Do

Iconic

- Walk the Brooklyn Bridge at sunrise or sunset
- Central Park (rent a bike or just wander)
- The Met Museum (give yourself at least 2 hours)

Culture

- Broadway show (TKTS booth for discounted same-day tickets)
- MoMA for modern art lovers
- Whitney Museum for contemporary art + rooftop views

Hidden gems

- The High Line (elevated park built on old train tracks)
 - Roosevelt Island Tram (cheap and scenic)
 - Grand Central's Whispering Gallery
